- 1. This report provides comparison crime figures for the month of January in 2018 and 2017, but due to the date of the meeting is only inclusive of 1st-29th for both months.
- 2. The levels of reported crimes remains low and is positive overall. Drugs offences have increased whilst Breaches of the Peace and Assaults have both remained static but the detection rate remains high with regard to these crime types.
- 3. There was 1 reported Housebreaking in January, which remained static and 1 car crime reported in the Ayr East ward this month, after none last year, residents should remain vigilant regarding leaving items visible in their cars and ensuring their homes and outbuildings are locked and secured correctly. The detections rates for these crimes remain quite low and anyone seen acting suspiciously should be reported to police immediately.
- 4. No drink or disqualified driving offences were detected in your ward area but our officers will continue high visibility patrols to deter road traffic crimes.
